

In the Footsteps of St. Jeanne Jugan

The Little Sisters of the Poor are united closely with each other throughout the world. We have one work, one mission in the Church: to care for the Elderly in need and to create a loving home for them. We were founded by St. Jeanne Jugan in 1839; the first actual step in beginning our Congregation was Jeanne carrying a blind, paralyzed elderly woman from a hovel and placing her in her own bed. Word spread quickly, and more and more elderly in need turned to Jeanne. Young women began to join her. They cared for the elderly, prayed with them and offered them a life of peaceful security.

In order to support the work Jeanne turned to any and all who would help her; she knocked on doors, approached businesses, farmers, pastors and families; she tirelessly walked throughout the countryside with her begging basket on her arm; it was said that she prayed with all her soul and collected with all her heart. Her benefactors became part of the spiritual family of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

We as Jeanne's followers strive do the same, and our benefactors truly become part of our spiritual family as they help us in manifold ways to care for our elderly Residents. And much like our foundress, we take to heart all of the special intentions that our donors confide to our prayers. Each day, several times a day,

Whatever it is, we take it seriously and we place those petitions in a basket in our Chapel in front of an image of St. Jeanne Jugan as a reminder that we owe a huge debt of gratitude to all who support our work.
